PREFACE

From the earliest times, women have revealed the divine song that sings through all creation. Their voices echo in Scripture, from the prophet Miriam's song after escaping slavery in Egypt (Exodus 15:20–21), to the prophet Deborah's victory hymn (Judges 5:1–31). Hannah sings in thanksgiving (1 Samuel 2:1–10) and Mary raises her voice in unending praise (Luke 14:46–55).

There is a long and celebrated tradition of women hymnists. The first plainchant hymn with known-authorship of both words and music by a woman was Hildegard of Bingen (1098–1179). Hildegard's visionary theology is matched by language of astounding creativity. Yet, like Julian of Norwich and Mechtild of Magdeburg, her voice remained silent for more than a thousand years. In 2012, she was named a Doctor of the Church by Pope Benedict XVI.

Women poets have long been disadvantaged in the fields of hymnody and hymnology, lacking equal access to colleges, theological seminaries, or tutors who respected their abilities. They had to rely on male pseudonyms or anonymity in order to be published. Nevertheless, by the second edition of Dr. John Julian's *Dictionary of Hymnology* in 1907, notably 10% of listed authors were female, representing 550 women. Among them are prolific translators such as Catherine Winkworth, with more than 250 listings; and writers whose hymns are among the most beloved of the nineteenth century.



This exciting new publication from Oregon Catholic Press marks an important milestone in the inclusion of women as authors and editors. It represents vitality of growth, from the 15% of texts by women in the second edition of *JourneySongs*, to a ground-breaking collection exclusively by women. Hymns are prayers, clothed in glorious melody, that inspire hope and express faith, build community, and form lasting memories to support the journey of life.

Unite Our Hearts offers an invaluable resource to music directors. With 54 metrical hymns by 23 living women, these texts are instantly singable to timeless melodies which have served the prayer of generations: ADORO TE DEVOTE, AZMON, BUNESAN, CONDITOR ALME SIDERUM, DARWALL'S 148th, FRANCONIA, and NETTLETON, to name but a few. The hymns in the collection are for formal and informal settings alike; Public Worship, Sunday Liturgy, Christian Initiation, Morning and Evening Prayer, Mealtimes, Worktimes, and Anniversaries.

In every generation the Gospel calls us to transformation. Catholic social teaching is based on Scripture and the signs of the times; on the belief that God has a plan for creation, a plan to build the reign of peace, love and justice. These innovative texts, grounded in Scripture and in poetry, provide inspiration for original melodies and for new collaborations among composers. They address the reality of life today; the natural world, care for the stranger, the abiding presence of Christ in creation, and the need for human wholeness.

A hymnal should reflect the contemporary experience of humanity. In the years since *JourneySongs* appeared in 1994 the world has changed. Events outside our frame of reference have taken place, from climate disasters to global pandemic. The web of life is sacred and we have just one common home, and yet we have become one of the most powerful, destructive forces on the planet. With the election of the first female Vice President of the United States, women's voices are emerging from the veil of history. Greta Thunberg, Malala Yousafzai, and Poet Laureate Amanda Gorman address the entire world when they call on us to "never again sow division."

Unite Our Hearts is a call to vibrant faith and action in our time. It could not have come about without the dedication, imagination and sheer hard work of Editor Barbara Bridge and her team. May these new interpretations of ancient truths enlighten our vision and point us towards the "Living Light" of Christ.

Psalm 24:1–2, 7–10 • John 1:1–14 • Philippians 2:6–11 • Revelation 3:20

The door of the human heart is like the gate of a city; it can be locked and closely guarded, or open and welcoming. In Psalm 24, verses 7 and 9, we pray: “Lift up your heads, O gates! and be lifted up, O ancient doors! that the King of glory may come in.”

Stanza one of this hymn acknowledges our inclination to put up barriers to protect ourselves from the all-powerful God, who created and rules the universe. But stanzas two and three assure us that this almighty God rules by love rather than by power. Although God is almighty, we need not fear being invaded against our will, because God respects our freedom and will never force us.

The Son of God laid aside the trappings of divinity to become vulnerable and human like us. In trust, wonder, and awe at God’s humility, gentleness, and reverence, stanzas three and four invite our Maker to unlock the gates of our hearts and cities to enter in.

This hymn is most fitting during the Season of Advent, as we prepare to welcome Christ more fully into our hearts and world.

While specific scriptural texts are not used in this piece, significant references can be found, most notably in the many names for Christ. Christ as Light of the World is mentioned in John 8:12, while Emmanuel and Radiant Dawn are cited in the O Antiphons. Verse three alludes to the Holy Family's flight to Egypt. (Matthew 2:13–15).

In thinking about Advent as a time of longing and hope, I began considering all the contemporary concerns of the world: immigration, loneliness, depression, poverty, corruption, hate, injustice, and abuse to name a few, and wanted to create a modern text that would link people of today with the ages-old longing for our Savior. An interesting thing to discover was, despite the desire for each generation to claim a new, better, and different way, the problems of today are similar to those suffered at the time of Christ. Sure, there is a new twist, but at the root, there is little difference. Humanity, by nature, is always in need of saving grace.

What does this say? Does it affect our hope? On the contrary, I find a great sense of holiness in the connection we share with those long ago who prayed for light in the darkness, who knew a savior would come, who faithfully placed their hope in God. We are one with those who, in poverty and desperation, prayed for grace, and who received a comfort, joy, and peace that can only come from the Lord. We continually seek his grace, and he continually comes to be with us. In Advent, we can experience most prominently this dance of hopeful longing and deep joy.

“Peace be with you!” Ever since I learned so many years ago how rich the meaning of the Hebrew word “Shalom” is, I have wanted to explore the various facets of this word that can be “a blessing, a greeting, a farewell, a statement of fact, a hope for the future, a prayer, a virtue, or other such manifestation of a relationship in which all is well with God, with others, with self, and even with creation.” (Anthony J. Tambasco, “Peace”, in *The Collegeville Pastoral Dictionary of Biblical Theology* (The Liturgical Press, 1996, 711). Its richness is as inexhaustible as the love of God, of which it is a particular manifestation.

“Peace be with you... I send you... he breathed on them...” How reminiscent these words of the Risen Christ are of John’s description of the death of Jesus in that same Gospel, “Then he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.” And how reminiscent that is of the wind of God, the Spirit of God hovering over the face of the waters in the first creation account in Genesis. I hear and feel the intense tenderness in these words, the closeness of the Creator God whose breath holds us in life. I feel my own aching for the depth of that peace—writing this as I am in the time of COVID-19’s assault on all aspects of our world, I feel the aching of sister and brother, elder and child, unbeliever and believer for a peace that heals the depth of everything: of bodies, spirits, of loneliness and isolation, of illness, and of death itself. The universe, it seems, even more so today than when this song was written, is aching for wholeness, for a peace that surpasses all our understanding.

Like the breath of God that moved over the waters at creation, the Spirit of the glorified Jesus is breathed out over all creation, a new creation whose reach we glimpse beyond the end of the cosmos. Our Eucharistic Prayers for Reconciliation recall this breath-giving act of creation: we call Christ “our Passover and our surest peace,” (I); we pray that the Spirit will “make your Church a sign of unity and an instrument of your peace” (II); we pray that we will be brought together to share “the unending banquet of unity in a new heaven and a new earth, where the fullness of [God’s] peace will shine forth in Jesus Christ our Lord.” The seeds of this peace are here; we see and feel and touch them in our own lives, and give thanks for their presence, for they reveal the presence of the risen Christ.

Many Easter hymns are triumphant—with good reason. This is Easter in a different form: powerful tenderness, the peace of the risen Lord to all his creation who holds us close and will, in the fullness of time, make us whole.
