Performance Notes

Rain Down was written for the Mass of Confirmation of 1992 at St. Bridget Church, Mesa, Arizona.

Try this song in different ways. Have the assembly sing the Refrain while a cantor sings the Verses. If done in this way, suggest that the cantor take some liberty with the melody, giving it a more gospel feel.

Or have the assembly sing the entire song using just the original melody. It's simple, easy, and works well.

My favorite way is a combination of both. The cantor sings Verse 1; the rest of the assembly joins in on Verse 2; and the choir adds the "ooh's and aah's" on Verse 3.

Regardless of how you do it, make sure to give it a nice, slow swing, as if you'd want your assembly to lock arms and sway as they sing. Enjoy singing the Refrain especially, and have fun.
